Early Help Assessment e-learning

The Early Help Assessment is an intervention tool to be used by all agencies working with a child with additional, unmet needs.

This free 60-90 minute e-learning course aims to give practitioners the understanding, knowledge, tools and confidence to complete an Early Help Assessment and be part of the holistic Early Help support for the child and their family. The course is for all practitioners, from any agency, working with children or young people who have additional unmet needs, including SfYC, Children's Social Care, Children's Centres, Education, Health, Police, Youth Support Services and other statutory and voluntary organisations.

Participants will learn how to:

- Explain how the Early Help model works within Hampshire
- Recognise the thresholds for Early Help
- Complete an Early Help Assessment using the appropriate paperwork
- Describe the role of the Early Help Co-coordinator
- Describe how to be part of the holistic Early Help support for the child and their family
- Demonstrate the outcomes for the family using the distance travelled tool
